Shane Hammett is a key member of the Alabama Criminal Justice Information Center team, responsible for the development and implementation of criminal justice projects for the agency. Shane was instrumental in the Alabama ACCORD Project, as he managed the re-architecture of the AlaCOP.gov information sharing environment to align with the Global Justice Reference Architecture and deploy an enterprise architecture based upon Service Oriented Architecture principles.

Since joining ACJIC, Shane has focused his efforts on enterprise architecture and national standards, and how they can help solve the challenges of intra-state and inter-state information sharing for Public Safety agencies and for Fusion Centers. Shane currently serves as the technical project lead for the State of Alabama on the CONNECT (Consortium for the Exchange of Criminal Justice Technology) Project, which is testing an inter-state information sharing architecture leveraging the Global Justice Reference Architecture and the Global Federated Identity and Privilege Management framework. As well, Shane currently serves as the Chairperson of the Southern Shield Technology Sub Committee. Southern Shield is a consortium of 14 state fusion centers seeking to develop and share best practices with fusion center technology and information sharing. Additionally, Shane serves on several state and federal standards steering committees.

Prior to joining ACJIC, Shane held a project management position with Regions Financial Corporation, where he was responsible for the implementation of large scale projects including three call centers. Prior to being Project Manager, he served in various roles as a Database Administrator, Software Developer, and Network Specialist with Regions.

Shane holds a degree in Management Information Systems from Auburn University and a Masters of Business Administration from Troy University.
